COURT NOTES.

The March term of the Circuit court is practically over. Although the term was short there was sufficient time for several interesting matters. We note that Mr. Lindblom wins the famous sidewalk suit of Lindblom vs Moseley for the third time and secures the largest verdict he has yet obtained, being full amount of his claim with interest and costs. Mr. Moseley is satisfied that there is nothing to be gained by an appeal to Appellate court and has already made arrangements to settle the judgment in full.

Out of thirty-two indictments, found by the Grand Jury, Highland had its share. Almost every saloon keeper in the City was invited by the Sheriff to appear before Judge Donnelly and "square himself." It is understood that this little piece of "cussedness" was an effort to reach Mayor Gibbs personally and was entirely for political effect. It is true that the Mayor was included in the indictments, but it is also true that the indictment was "nolle prossed" as soon as the true situation was laid before the state's attorney.
