A meeting of the Western Golf Association was held at the Grand Pacific hotel Wednesday afternoon to elect officers and decide upon the places and dates for tournaments. The clubs represented were Chicago, Belmont, Homewood, Milwaukee, Midlothian, Westard Ho, Glen View, Exmoor, Hinsdale, Waukegan and Des Moines.

The list of officers recommended by the nominating committee was not materially changed and the following officers will be in power this year.
