Everetts, re-elected alderman second gan. ward by 60 votes-no opponent; Joseph F. Leaming, elected alder-Sheridan Road Publishing Co. man third ward by 64 votes-C. W. Kirk received 4 votes although he was not a candidate; John Hart, Jr., elected alderman fourth ward by 111 votes against Geo. L Brand 45 votes and John+A. Bailey 21 votes.
