HIGHLAND PARK CITY COUNCIL.

Regular meeting Tuesday evening, all on hand save attorney Smoot. Clerk Finney in reading the records of the discussion of the automobile ordinance read "Autocrats" instead of auto cars, which alderman Everett thought savored too much of a famous breakfast table. Somebody down in the McDaniel's suburb wants a street lamp. Mr. Wain of the new Exmoor sub-division asked permission to put up a huge sign west of the Moses block for his lots: Refused. A letter was read from Hob-o-ken (accent on the last syllable) N. Y., to the effect that the Carnegie money will be ready when the city gets a lot. The board of health had extended the west side sewer at an expense of \$32.13. Pumping station report was read and a copy ordered for each alderman. Why not have it printed in the paper so every citizen can have a copy of it?

The finance committee reported against changing the city's deposits from the Chicago Merchants Loan and Trust bank to our local banks and the report was adopted by a unanimous vote. As ex-Judge Levi M. Comstock was the only bidder for a new sidewalk on Forest avenue south, he got the contract. The balance of W. J. Obee's bill for repair work on the big fill in the Sheridan Road in Ravinia of some \$300 was left with the street and alley committee. The painting of the water tower was let to Weibel & McKinney for \$185. The old warrant for the sidewalk in front of J. C. Cushman's place of \$174.34 came up again, as it has been due for some two years and was ordered paid and then unless Mr. Cushman pays the bill the present walk will be torn up and he will have to pay \$200 or more for a new one. One alderman said that was "an honest debt" and if Mr. Cushman did not pay it he was "not a good citizen."

There was a long talk over the rather slipshod way of O. K.-ing bills and a loud demand for system and order in city purchases. Alderman Dooley made a vigorous speech on this and was ably seconded by Messrs. Leaming, Morton and others. One good thing should be set to the credit

of the Cobb administration, it conducted the purchasing department of the city in a business like manner, and now it will be in vogue again. Several aldermen want the city water analyzed and some did not want to get up any health bugbear and a scare; there are a nearly half a dozen choice residences unrented now and did not want to do anything to increase the number. At ten o'clock the meeting adjourned.
