 Parents and guardians of chil-
 dren of the proper age to begin

 class for children who are enter-

 two school weeks of September.
 If small children do not enter
 during that period, it will later on
 be necessary for them to wait un-
 til another beginning class is or-
 ganized in February. As to chil-
 dren almost within school age the
 rule is observed that those whose
 6th birthday will occur 90 days
 from the opening of the school
 year may enter at the same time
 with the others.

By arrangement with the Town-
 ship Board of Education, grades
 6, 7, and 8 will occupy rooms on
 the lower floor of the high school
 building for the coming school
 year. All such pupils, however,
 will assemble first at the Elm
 Place school on the morning of
 September 8th.

New pupils should present sat-
 isfactory evidence of vaccination,
 and all pupils the time limit of
 whose certificates has expired
 should be revaccinated.

 city of Highland Park be graded, drained,
 paved with macadam and otherwise improved
 from the south line of Park avenue southerly
