CORNER STONE LAID.

Last Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock, the corner stone, 22x26 inches face size, was placed in the northwest corner of the new Catholic church, Highland Park. In the center of the face is a bas-relief cross and crown and around it is the inscription, "St Mary's Church Rebuilt 1903." In spite of the intense heat many hundreds of our people and others from other places gathered to witness the impressive ceremony and listen to the very able and forcibly delivered sermon by Rev. P. C. Conway, of St. Pius church, Chicago and the timely address by Bishop Muldoon.

The bishop and some forty of the clergy of the diocese, including Rev. Dean Flaherty, of Rockford; Rev. P. V. Byrne, C. M., president of St. Vincent's college; Rev. M. J. Marsile, C. S. V., president of St. Viateur college, Kankakee, and Chaplain Vattman of Fort Sheridan, participated in the exercises.

The bishop and other clergy were met at the depot by a procession led by the 20th Infantry band of 18 pieces from Fort Sheridan; St. John's Court of Foresters, of Lake Forest and Highland Park; the Young Men's Society, of Lakeside and the Wankegan council of the Knights of Columbus, and marched to the parochial residence and thence to the church. In addition to the laying of the corner stone, the sites of the altars, inside the edifice, were blessed and then came the addresses from the porch of the parish house. A generous collection was then taken for the building enterprise.

The sermon was strong, clear and forcible, while the address of the bishop was one of the most timely in its condemnation of the lavish waste by so many wealthy monies that should go to Christ's cause and so especially, the prevalent laxity in the matter of divorce as now practiced. Everyone of the thousands who listened ought to set his face against the things the bishop condemned.

If ever the right man was in the right place, that man is pastor, Rev. J. J. Morrisey, of St. Mary's church. He is not only an intelligent, earnest and faithful

priest to his parish, but he is a man among men; a helper of every good cause in this community and is very highly esteemed by all.

TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL.

For the coming year the faculty of the Deerfield Township High School will consist of the following: Richard L. Sandwick, principal; William A. Averhill, F. B. Williams, Blanche Shearer, Fannie B. Bliss, Ethel Pardee, Nell Williams, Helen Bradshaw and Eva Wycoff.

The announcement of courses for 1903-1904 will be ready for distribution about the first of September. In language and literature, English, Latin, Greek, French and German will be offered; in history, ancient, mediaeval, modern, English and American history with civics; in science, physics, chemistry, physiography and biology; in pure mathematics, algebra, elementary and advanced plane and solid geometry, and trigonometry; in manual training, bench work, lathe work, pattern making, mechanical drawing and designing; in business, bookkeeping, commercial arithmetic and commercial law. Besides the preceding there will be offered courses in physical culture, music and art.

Entrance examinations will be held the 12th of September in the high school building beginning at 9 o'clock. Applicants will be examined in Arithmetic through percentage, Geography, Grammar and United States History.

The new term will begin September 14.
