School will begin for the chil-
dren in district 107, Tuesday
morning, September 8th. The

The board of education has for
some weeks been facing the prob-
lem how to install eleven teachers
with their respective classes in an
eight room building. Finally the
Township board of education in
recognition of the grave necessity
that confronted the board of edu-
cation of district 107, made a
proposition to rent three rooms on
the first floor of the high school
building for the upper grammar
grades for one year beginning
September 8th. The proposition
has been accepted, and on Tues-
day, September 8th, grades 6, 7
and 8 will be seated in the new
temporary quarters. These will
have the same time schedule as
those of the lower grades, includ-
ing an hour and a half noon inter-
mission.

At the Elm place building rad-
ical changes in the methods of
heating and ventilating the build-
ings are being made. These in-
clude the instalation of an eight
horse-power fan to force temper-
ed air into the school room and
expell foul air from the building.
This will insure perfect ventila-
tion.
