HOLD-UP EASILY FOILED.

With Valuables in Left Hand Protection Is Perfect-Plan Has Sanction of Police.

A man who carries his money and that few people have thought of it. Yet it has the sanction of the police, and its efficacy has been proven in more than one instance, says the Chicago Tribune.

As soon as the citizen is confronted by the hold-up man he will, if he has his money and his watch in his hand, throw them on the nearest lawn or into the ditch. No highway robber has time to stop and look for either. There is no sense in carrying valuables in the right hand, because the first move of every accomplished hold-up man is: to grab his victim by his right arm. The movement is made to prevent the

The man who tries to draw a revolver while the hold-up man is in front of him takes his life in his hands. If a citizen carries a revolver at all he should carry it in his right hand while in a dangerous street. His money and his watch should always be in his left. Then after he had thrown them away and the robber has departed discomfited the victim can take his time about finding his property.

This simply plan discounts all the revolvers, sword canes, slungshots, and brass knuckles ever invented and away takes but a fraction of a second,
