Special Assessment Notice No. 89.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, having ordered that a connected system of sewers with manholes, flush tank and house connection slants, be constructed and laid in the City of Highland Park, as follows:

That a sewer shall begin at the septic tank now located outside of the corporate limits of said city, on the Deerfield road, about 688 feet west of said corporate limits, from thence said sewer shall run in a straight line to the intersection of the center line of Deerfield Avenue with the west corporate limits of the City of Highland Park, from thence it shall run easterly along the center line of Deerfield Avenue a distance of twenty-one hundred and twelve (2112) feet and stop.

A sewer shall be constructed on Hickory Street, from and connecting with the sewer to be laid in Deerfield Avenue, at the intersection of the center line of Hickory Street with the center line of Deerfield Avenue, and shall run from thence northerly along the center line of Hickory Street to its intersection with the center line of Laurel Avenue.

A sewer shall be constructed on Laurel Avenue, from and connecting with the said sewer on Hickory Street, at the intersection of the center line of Hickory Street and Laurel Avenue, and shall run thence easterly along the center line of Laurel Avenue to its intersection with the center line of McGovern Street.

A sewer shall be constructed on McGovern Street from and connecting with said sewer on Laurel Avenue, at the intersection of the center lines of Laurel Avenue and McGovern Street and shall run thence southerly along the center line of McGovern Street to its intersection with the center line of Deerfield Avenue.

The ordinance for the same being on file in office of the City Clerk of said City, and having applied to the County Court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the 15th day of December, A. D. 1903, or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.

Said assessment is payable in ten (10) installments with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, on all installments from and after date of the first voucher. All persons desiring may file objections in said court before said day, and may appear on the hearing and make their defense.

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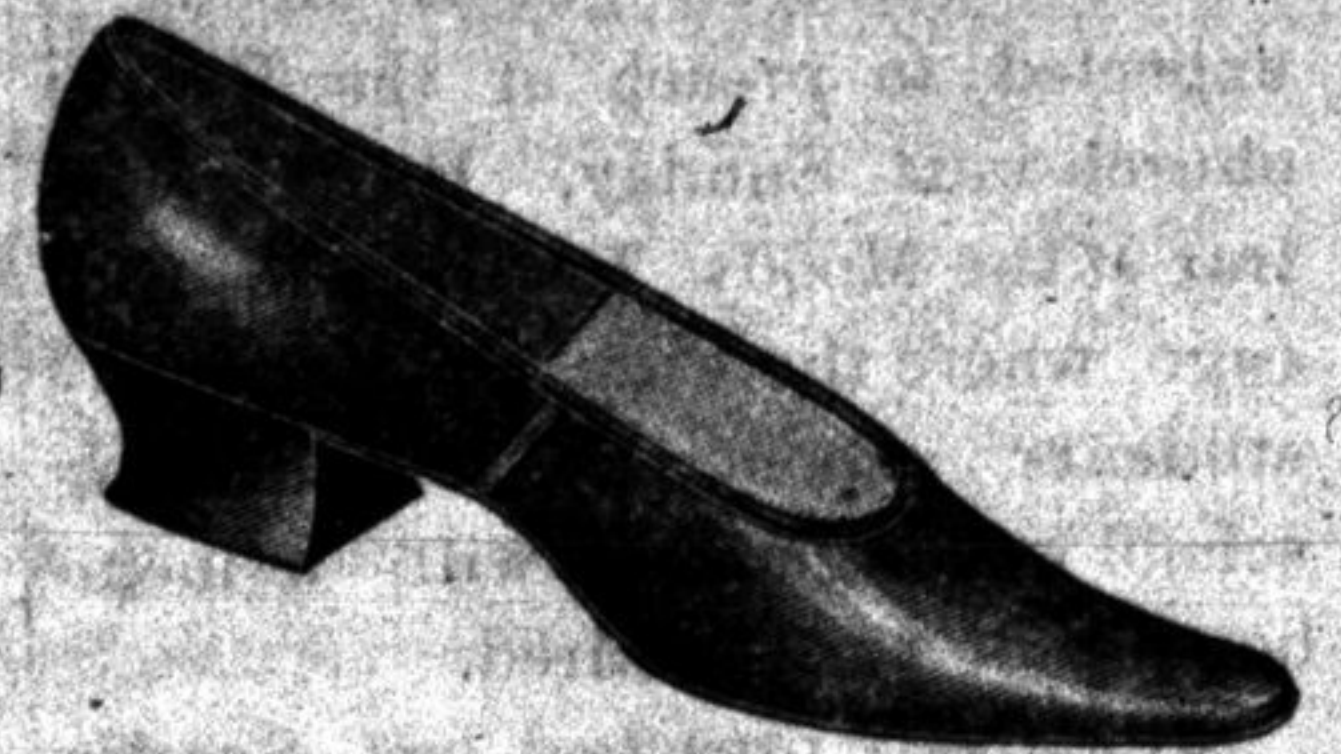
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
