Rev. A. A. Pfanstiehl returned this week from a visit to St. Louis, Mo. He preached two sabbaths in one of the St. Louis churches.


Mr. Fred Mierhoff's father died at Winnetka, Wednesday at 5 p. m., of old age. He had been residing with his daughter at that place.
