WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of said Public Library, by resolution duly adopted, have declared said site unfit and unsuitable as and for a public main water supply pipe, together with fire library si e and have further declared hydrants, shut off valves and special castings that they do not desire to use said Williams Avenue, in said C ty of Highland property as and for a public library;

W HEREAS, Said Board of Directors of said public library have further selected a new site and have arranged to purchase certain real estate for such site. and the City Council of said city is of the opinion that the real estate hereinaf er described is no longer necessary. appropriate or required for the use of said City of Highland Park, or of said Public Library, or the Board of Directors thereof, and is no longer profitable to nor its longer retention is for the best interests of said city, therefore:
