Sidewalk Ordinance

An ordinance providing for the construction of a concrete sidewalk on the northerly side of Park avenue from a point thirty-four (34) feet easterly from the easterly line of Linden avenue westerly to a point four hundred and seventy- wo and erly line of Linden avenue, in the city of Highland Park, county of Lake and state of Illinois.

Be it ordained by the city Council of the city of Highland Park, county of Lake and state of Illinois:

SEC. 1. That a concrete cement sidewelk be constructed in the city of Highland Park in, upon and along the northerly side of Park avenue from a point thirty-four feet easterly from the easterly line of Linden avenue, thence westerly to a point four hundred and seventy-two and three-fourths feet westerly from the westerly line of Linden avenue, except at street intersections, in front of lot seventeen (17) in block twenty-nine (29), lots four (4), five (5), and then easterly one hundred twenty-three and seventy-five one hundredths (123.75) feet in block twentyone (21) in said city of Highland Park.
