Notice is hereby given that bids will be received for grading, draining, paving with macadam and otherwise improving Broadway in said City, from its intersection with the west line of Sheridan Road to a point 12 1/2 feet west of the center line of Oak street, produced south in its course across said Broadway and Oak Street from its junction with the north line of the paved roadway provided on Broadway north to the south line of Walker avenue, otherwise known as Sheridan Road, as a whole, in accordance with the ordinance therefor.
