

COUNTY SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION.

We regret that lack of space does not permit us to add the full program to the following report of the county Sunday school convention held last week at Libertyville. But we are glad to have this report, which is kindly furnished us by the secretary, Rev. A. T. Stephens, of Gray's Lake.

On Thursday and Friday, October 13 and 14, the convention of the Sunday schools of Lake county was held at Libertyville. During the two days something like one hundred and seventy-five delegates registered, representing nearly all of the sixty-one schools in the county. Over two hundred delegates were in attendance.

The reports of the county officers show a decrease of one in the number of schools, but a general increase in attendance and activity. One hundred and thirty-two are reported as having entered the membership of the various churches from the Sunday schools during the year.

The convention was greatly blessed by the presence and help of Rev. Henry Moser, State field worker, and Mrs. H. L. Hill, State secretary of primary work. Mr. Moser was on the program at each session, and brought what he himself said we all came to get, instruction and inspiration.

Mrs. Hill was the principal speaker during the primary hour on Friday afternoon, giving an address on "Teaching through Object and Illustration," which was extremely wise and sensible, decrying the sort of object lessons in which the objects cover up the lesson, and recommending the use of stories. Mrs. Hill's teaching of the next Sunday's lesson as she would to a primary class was a capital illustration of her own address.

The different advance steps in Sunday school work—cradle roll, home department, teachers' meetings, normal classes, etc., all received emphasis.

Two Bible studies were given during the convention, one Thursday afternoon, by Rev. A. T. Stephens, of Gray's Lake, using the lesson of Elisha and the raising of the Shunamite's woman's son to enforce the lesson to Sunday school teachers of the need of both prayer and personal contact if

they would see their scholars raised into a new life in Jesus Christ. The second Bible hour was conducted by Rev. G. D. Rogers, of Highland Park, using the passages in Deut. vi:1-10 and Neh. viii:1-8, to illustrate an old-fashioned Bible school, which had many features necessary in a school today.

The largest and most enthusiastic meeting was on Thursday evening, when "Classes for Men" was the topic, Rev. Myron W. Haynes, of Chicago, being the speaker. A special car brought delegates from the men's classes in Waukegan, and much interest and enthusiasm was aroused.

The convention singing was a great feature. Prof. S. H. Meyer of Chicago, was the leader, and he seemed to have the power to get everyone to sing, whether they ever did before or not. Mr. Meyer is one of the best leaders of Sunday school singing ever heard in Lake county.

Next year the convention will meet at Highland Park.

Louis Fleischmann, a wealthy New York baker, who was the founder of what is known as the "bread line," passed away recently. Five hundred loaves a night are handed out free to hungry men and women who form in line, and in winter hot coffee is given with the bread.
