**Annual Town Meeting and Election**

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters and electors of the town of Deerfield in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, that the annual town meeting and election of officers of said town will take place Tuesday, the third day of April, A. D. 1906 being the first Tuesday in said month.

(1) The election will begin at 7 a. m. and close at 5 p. m. in the places designated as follows:

(2) 1st Precinct; Priors' Building, No. 27 North Sheridan Road, Highland Park.

2nd Precinct; City Building, Highwood.

3rd precinct; City Department Building, corner of Central avenue and Green Bay Road, Highland Park.

The officers to be elected are: One Assistant Supervisor, One Town Clerk, One Assessor, One Collector, One Commissioner of Highways.

(3) The town meeting will open in Library Building, Sheridan Road, Highland Park. at the hour of 2 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, and after choosing a Moderator will proceed to hear and consider reports of officers, to appropriate money to defray the necessary expense of the township, and to deliberate and decide on such measures as may, in pursuance of law, come before the meeting.
