

HIGHLAND PARK NEWS-LETTER

Special Assessment Notice No. 106

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, having ordered that a connected system of sewers with manholes, flush tanks, and house connection slants, be constructed in said city, as follows:

Commencing in the bottom of the ravine which runs through Blocks 45, 46 and 47, and between 48 on the north and Blocks 31 and 33 on the south and commencing and connecting with the manhole now located in the public sewer in the bottom of said ravine at a point where said Blocks 31, 33 and 48 join or touch each other, thence westerly through said ravine to St. Johns Avenue, thence southerly along St. Johns Avenue to High Street, now known as Moraine Road, thence westerly on said High Street to a point 25 feet easterly from the easterly line of Waukegan Avenue.

Also on St. Johns Avenue from the point where said ravine crosses said St. Johns Avenue, thence northerly to Highwood Avenue, thence westerly along Highwood Avenue to a point 25 feet east of the west corporate limits of the City of Highland Park. Also on St. Johns Avenue from Highwood Avenue thence northerly to Walker Avenue, thence on Walker Avenue to a point 25 feet east of the west corporate limits of the City of Highland Park. Also on Bloom Street from St. Johns to Waukegan Avenue; also northerly on Waukegan Avenue from Bloom Street to the northwesterly corporate limits of the City of Highland Park; also on Bloom Street from Waukegan Avenue to First Street, thence southerly on First Street for a distance of 726 feet also on Logan Street, from Bloom Street thence northerly for a distance of 400 feet; also on Bloom Street from St. Johns Avenue easterly to a point 225 feet easterly from the intersection of the center line of Bloom Street with the center line of Maria Street produced southerly in its course across said Bloom Street, also on West Street from Bloom Street north to a point 25 feet south of the south line of Walker Avenue; also on Maria Street from Bloom Street north a distance of 363 feet; also on Clark Street, from the said sewer in said ravine, thence northerly on Clark Street to a point 25 feet south of the south line of Lot 4 produced west in its course across said Clark Street, in Block 2 Port Clinton, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City, and having applied to the County Court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the 9th day of April, A. D. 1906, or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.

Said assessment is payable in Ten (10) installments with interest at the rate of Five (5) per centum per annum on all installments from and after date of first voucher.

All persons desiring may file objections in said court before said day, and may appear on the hearing and make their defense.
