Ordinances have been passed and work will soon be commenced on cement sidewalks on the following street: On the west side of Waukegan avenue from the northerly limits of the City of Highland Park to Crofton street; on both sides of Highwood avenue from the westerly limits of the City of Highland Park to High street; on the south side of Prairie avenue from Railroad avenue to the westerly limits of the city of Highwood; on Euclid avenue, west side, from Highwood to Prairie avenues on the east side of Palmer avenue from Highwood to North avenues; on the west side of Railway avenue from Prairie avenue to Washington street.

Negotiations are in progress to put new water mains, from 1000 to 1500 feet extent, but all the arrangements are not yet completed.

Judge Pease was honored by the democrats of Lake County at their county convention at Libertyville Thursday, by being unanimously nominated as candidate for county superintendent of schools.
