The evening program of that day will appeal strongly to lovers of Tschaikowsky's music. containing his fifth symphony. On Friday evening a Wagner program will be the offering, an I Mr. L. de Mare will play the French horn solo in Siegfried's Rhine Journey from "Die Goetterdaemmerang".
