Monday, December 10th, 1906, at the office of the City Clerk in the City Hall, Highwood, Illinois, for the construction of four (4) inch cast iron water supply pipe as follows, to-wit:

1-Warrant No. 12: That a four (4) inch cust iron water supply pipe of a weight of 22 lbs per lineal foot be constructed in a portion of Washington Avenue from and connecting with the water supply pipe now laid in Railway Avenue, at a point eight (8) feet north of the center line of Washington Avenue, running west to a point 150 feet west of the west line of North Central Avenue, together with one (1) fire hydrant complete and one (1) Gates valve complete.

2-Warrant No. 13: That a four (4) inch cast iron water supply pipe of a weight of 22 lbs per lineal foot be constructed in portions of Palmer Avenue. North Avenue, Funston Avenue, Burchell Avenue, Llewellyn Avenue and North Central Avenue, as follows, to-wit: from and connecting with the water supply pipe now laid in Highwood Avenue at a point (8) feet west of the center line of Palmer Avenue, thence running north parallel with and eight (8) feet west of the center line of Palmer Avenue to a point eight (8) feet north of the center line of North Avenue; thence running west parallel with and eight (8) feet North of the center line of North Avenue to a point eight (8) feet west of the center line of North Central Avenue; thence running North parallel with and eight (8) feet west of the Center line of North Central Avenue to a point one hundred and seventy-five (175) feet north of the north line of North Avenue; also from and connecting with the water supply pipe to be constructed in North Avenue at a point eight (8) feet west of the center line of Funston Avenue; running thence north parallel with and eight (8) feet west of the center of Funston Avenue to a point eight (8) feet north of the center line of Burchell Avenue; thence running west parallel with and eight (8) feet north of the center line of Burchell Avenue to a point eight (8) feet west of the center line of North Central Avenue, also from and connecting with the water supply pipe to be constructed in Funston Avenue at a point eight (8) feet north of the center line of Llewellyn Avenue; thence running west parallel with and eight (8) feet north of the center line of Llewellyn Avenue to a point eight (8) feet west of the center of North Central Avenue together with five (5) fire hydrants and five (5) gate valves and in trenches excavated to such a depth that there shall be five and one-half (5%) feet of cover below the present surface of said streets and above the top of the pipe.

3-Warrant No. 14: That a four (4) inch cast iron water supply pipe of a weight of twenty-two (22) pounds per lineal foot, be constructed in a portion of Evolution Avenue from and cornecting with the water supply pipe now laid in Highwood Avenue, at a point eight (8) feet west of the center line of High Street; thence running south, parallel with and (8) feet west of the center line of Evolution Avenue, to a point six hundred (600) feet south of the south line of Highwood Avenue, together with one (1) fire hydrant and one (1) gate valve.

4-Warrant No. 15: That a four (4) inch cast-iron water supply pipe of a weight of twenty-two (22) pounds per lineal foot be constructed in Central Avenue from and connecting with the water supply pipe now laid in Prairie Avenue at a point eight (8) feet West of the center line of Central Avenue; thence running South and parallel with and eight (8) feet West of the center line of said Central Avenue to a point three hundred and nine-

ty-six (396) feet South of the South line of Prairie Avenue together with one (1) fire hydrant and one (1) gate valve.

Separate bids should be made for each of said improvements as above set forth, and as shown by said plans and specifications.

For such labor and materials the contractor is to be paid in eash out of the collections for the special assessments for the same, when collected pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided.

Special Assessment Bonds to be issued drawing interest at 5% per annum.

The Board of Local Improvements reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to accept bids as applied to each street separately, or to any number of streets, or to let the whole in bulk, as the Board may elest.

No bids will be received later than 10 o'clock a. m., Monday, December 10, 1906.

No proposal will be considered unless the party offering it shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board of Local Improvements of his ability, and that he has the necessary facilities, together with sufficient pecuniary resources, to fulfill the conditions of the contract and specifications, provided such contract should be awarded to him.
