NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED, That the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, having ordered that a connected system of streets in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, be graded, drained, paved with macadam an otherwise improved, as follows:

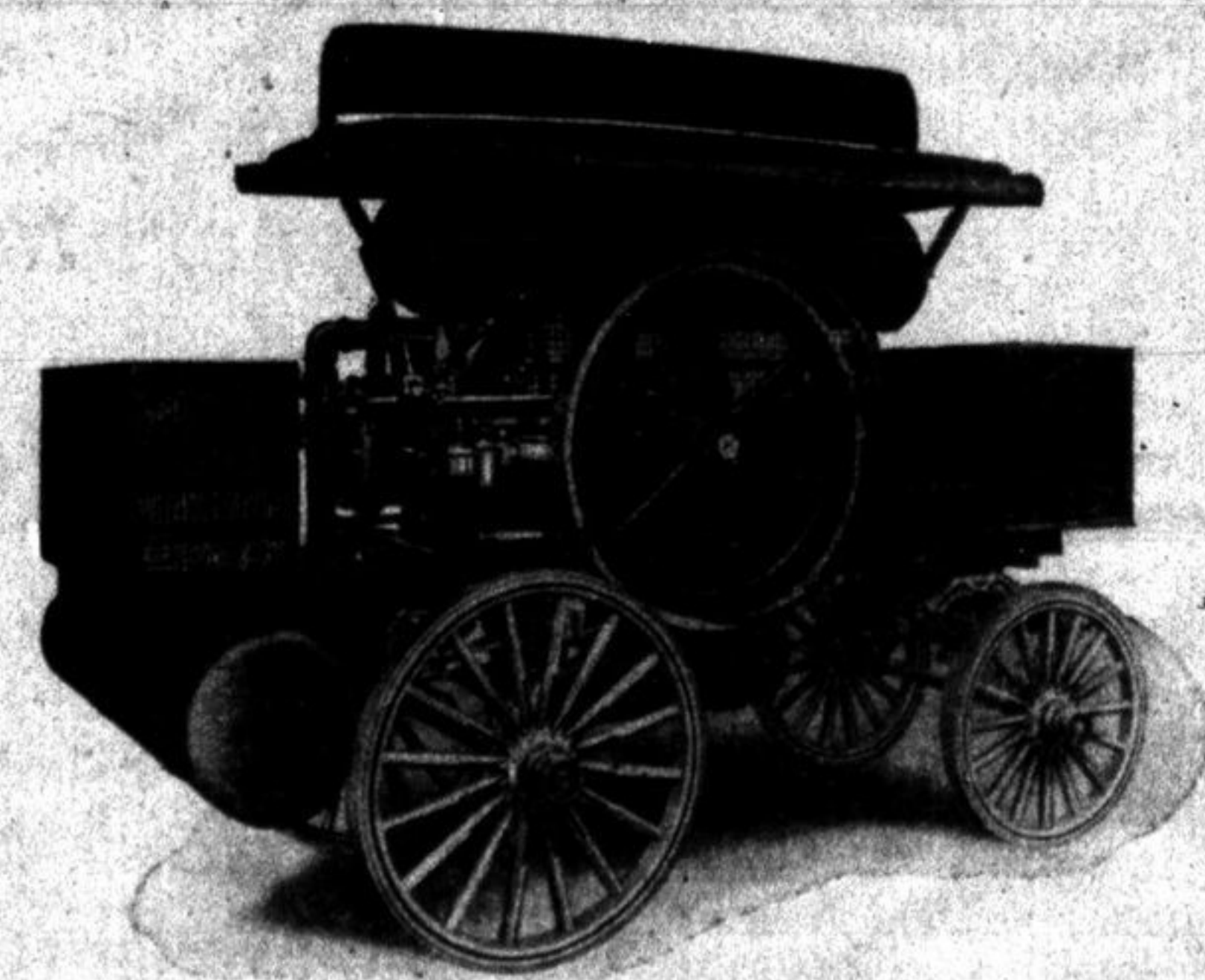
