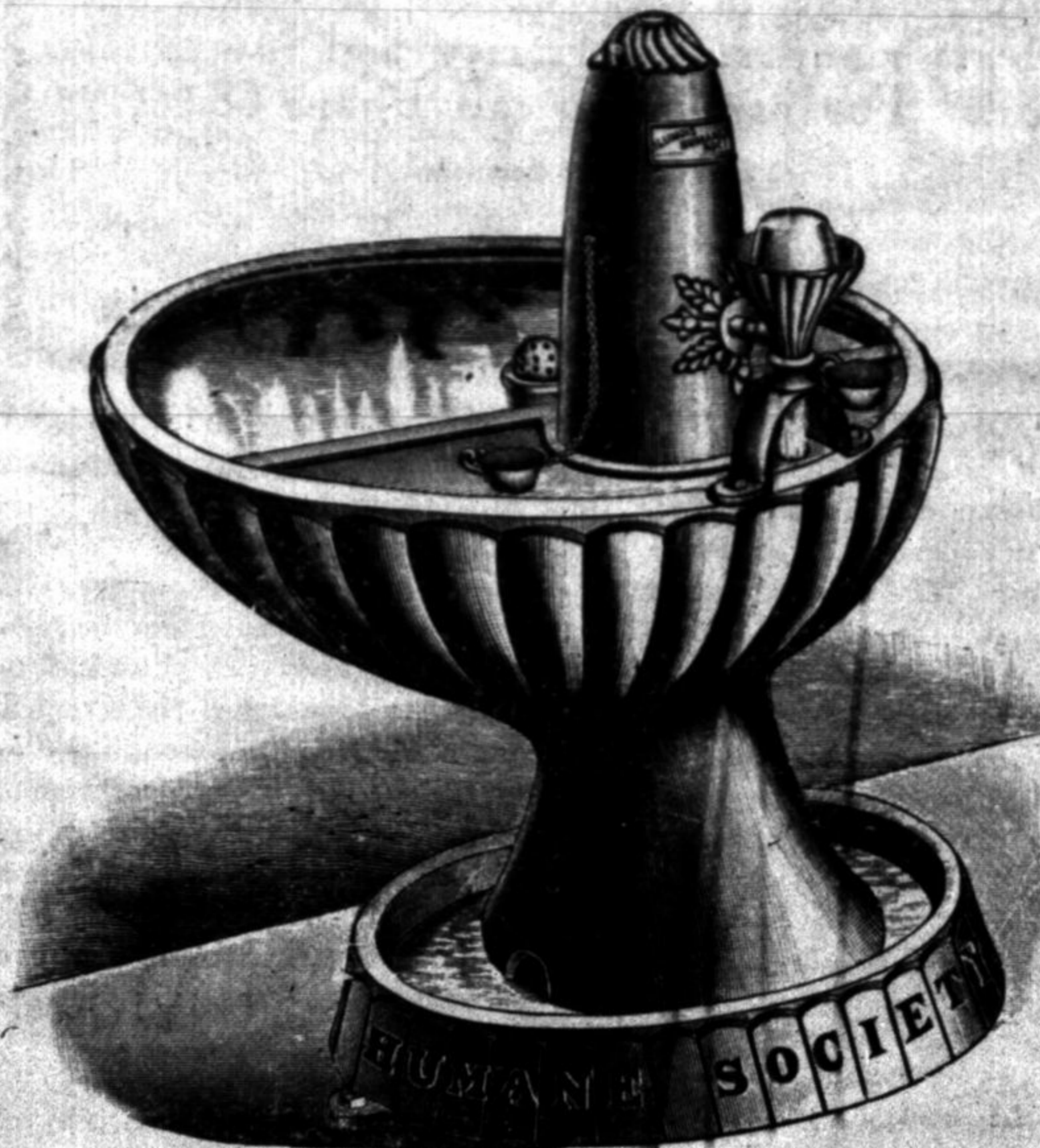

Six years is the age requirement for children entering school for the first time, but any child whose sixth birthday will occur not later than the end of the second month of the present term may enter with those of the required age. All children entering school for the first time should be enrolled during September, as after that month no other class for beginners is organized until February 1.

All school pupils should possess a valid certificate of vaccination. A certificate which has been in force five years or more is not considered valid.
