The next question is: Shall we be making our city so large that the conditions of poor roads, lack of sewers, bad sidewalks and insufficient light will be intensified. Instead, all will be improved. Highwood is not in position to-day to go on with improvements because of lack of funds, and the trouble experienced in finding market for her bonds. This, however, would all be remedied under the City government of Highland Park.

Next is asked: Shall we take over the liquor and gambling questions which have ruined Highwood. There will be no liquor or gambling questions to take over. We will take over the City as a whole, when it will cease to exist only as a part of Highland Park and subject to our laws.

I believe we will be to blame if the evil we complain of continues to exist, when we have the opportunity of remedying it by annexation.

Annex and we can control, let the opportunity pass and we have no longer the right to complain of whatever conditions may exist in Highwood.

#### RAVINIA PLEADS.

The Editor the North Shore NEWS LETTER:

DEAR SIR.—In view of the fact that there is a movement on foot to annex Highwood to the City of Highland Park, we wish to bring to your attention the unfortunate conditions existing in the southern part of the Third Ward of Highland Park, otherwise known as Ravinia.

This part of Highland Park, through the middle of which Roger Williams avenue runs, is greatly neglected. There are no public sewers, no improved streets and very few modern sidewalks, and, inasmuch as the territory is rapidly filling up more property having changed hands and more houses having been built within the last eight months than in several years preceding, the need for a public sewer becomes each day more and more vital to the health and well-being of the residents. The need for better streets and better sidewalks also daily becomes more and more important.

About a year ago an association was formed known as the Ravinia improvement Association, the purpose of which is, as its name implies, to improve conditions in the territory which it serves. This association last Summer brought to the attention of the Council the above intolerable conditions and asked for relief, but none seems forthcoming as yet.

It seems to us that in all fairness, the City of Highland Park should direct its attention to the betterment of any unfortunate conditions now existing in its own City Limits before it adds its obligation such as would be assumed by the annexation of Highwood.
