Dramatic Notes

The Princess—Our reporter visited the beautiful Princess Theatre last week and saw the stock company there enact Hough and Adams' sparkling musical comedy "A Stubborn Cinderella". This play is fittingly described in its advertisements as one of exceptionally high quality. The music for the play contrary to the usual run of plays of this kind is catchy and the scenery and costumes are among the most beautiful the writer has ever seen. Mr. John Barrymore as "Max" was excellent. His acting save in the love scenes of the play being well finished.

Mr. Robert Harrington as Skeeter was at best only a fair imitation of Geo. M. Cohen with whom he was associated for many years. Mr. James Marlowe in the role of Col. Hunt, Lady Leslies escort did some fine comedy work. Of the acting of Miss Sallie Fisher as Lady Leslie the leading lady too much cannot be said. Blessed with magnificent beauty and a delightful high bell-like soprano voice she left the impression which felt like more. The whole play is an immense success and in the words of James O'Donnell Bennett should remain at the Princess a year.

The Whitney—On Tuesday evening through the courtesy of Mr. F. O. Peers the manager of the Whitney Opera House a representative of the NEWS LETTER viewed the musical farcical "A Broken Idol" for the first time. Mr. Peers will be remembered by many local amusement seekers as the gentleman who sold the entrance tickets at Ravinia Park last season. "A Broken Idol" is an American comedy laid partially in China town, and California. It follows too much the traditional musical comedy lines to be especially interesting, but on the whole is a creditable entertainment. The average American who goes to the theatre does so to have his sense of humour enlarged and not (we regret to admit) to be dramatically educated. The music of the play is reasonably good the best numbers being Mr. Harlan's "Politics" and Miss Alice Yorke's "What makes the World Go Round" and "A Little China Doll". A mere mention of the much advertised American beauty chorus is sufficient. If such specialties were omitted the morale of the present day, stage would be much improved. The best mechanical feature of the play is an air ship in which Miss Alice Yorke sings the finale of the second act floating over the audience. Mr. Otis Harlan as Doctor What kept the audience in roars of laughter. His comedy work is of the finest quality and he is easily the best of the masculine roles. Miss Madge Voe as Sun Wee, the diminutive Chinese give, gave a realistic picture of all that is willing and subservient to parental authority. Beautiful little Alice Yorke as the ingenue of the play was excellent. She has a soft melodious voice and is aided by both magnificent costuming and a natural gift of acting creating an impression that is not easily forgotten. Lack of space prevents a record of the others in the cast but they all aided in making the evening highly enjoyable.

McVickers—Great interest is being felt in the approaching production of Rida Johnston Young's Irish fantasy "Ragged Robin". This is the first time it has been given here and press reports say that it is wonderfully beautiful. We shall if possible present a review of this play.
