

Four Sudden Deaths.

Last Sunday Highland Park lost four of their citizens in sudden decease. Mr. P. M. Evans well known here as the former proprietor of Evans grocery "the predecessor of Mr. Johnson's establishment," was found dead in his bed. Mr. Evans had been ailing for some time and his sudden death was ascribed to heart failure.

Mr. John Duffy Sr., who also died on Sunday, suffered severe injuries a few weeks ago by falling on a cement sidewalk which brought on a series of paralytic strokes which ended fatally.

The other two deaths were those of Mr. Pfister and Mr. H. Dittmer, youngest baby.

The child, Anna Dittmer, died under an operation. She was buried on Tuesday. The funeral service being conducted at the house by Rev. B. R. Schultze.

AN OBITUARY.

Filmore M. Evans, West Central ave., died last Sunday morning quite suddenly, the cause being heart failure. He was born March 27th, 1851 at Steuben, Onondaga county, New York. He passed his early years on the home farm and within the state of his birth. He came to Highland Park in October 1873, thirty-five years ago. He was married May 8, 1879, almost thirty years ago to Barbara Rudolph.

Mr. Evans was engaged in the brick and mercantile business with the two brothers, who also have lived these years in Highland Park.

He leaves a widow and four brothers to mourn his death. His brothers, John G. Evans of Columbus, Ohio; Henry R. Evans of Holland Patent, New York; Thomas P. Evans of Winnetka and Robert G. Evans of this city, were all present at the funeral, which was held Wednesday from his late residence. It was a matter of remark that the six pallbearers, and the officiating minister were all nephews of the deceased. A niece also, sang. He was buried at Rose Hill.

In his every relation, Mr. Evans was characterized by an unswerving honesty in business and a geniality of manner which made every one his friend. Many friends and relatives feel keenly his sudden passing into the region beyond.

Lake County Law and Order League

Secretary Quayle of the Lake County Law and Order League in his report for November, gives the following:

HIGHWOOD:—Great difficulty has been experienced in serving papers on the keepers of the half dozen blind pigs. Evidence has been secured and the Sheriff has arrested some of the violators, but some of the constables have not been willing to follow up his work.

The matter will now be left to the States Attorney's office and action there will doubtless be taken in the near future.

The dancing pavilion, the center of so much dissipation, and the roof under which brutal prize fights have taken place, has been destroyed by fire, from the moral standpoint we have no regrets to express, as it has been a curse to the district for years. Prize fights and pugilistic encounters have been permanently stopped in Lake county, and the credit is due to Sheriff Griffin.

NORTH CHICAGO:—Since the last report a decided change for the better has taken place in North Chicago. The village authorities have not been entirely indifferent. Three of the places have been closed up in the last month. A few days ago a trial was held in the Village Hall before Justice Shoup, who promptly decided it in favor of Ed. Doyle, the man charged. Two more trials are being held. The saloon keepers of the south end of Waukegan have asked my assistance in prosecuting those who are selling illegally.

LIBERTYVILLE:—I have been able to aid the branch League in securing evidence against the saloons of Libertyville for running wide open on the Sunday. Evidence was secured against three and convictions were had in each case.

DEERFIELD:—The branch League at this point irritated by the almost open liquor selling on Sunday, have also started a crusade and asked my aid. Warrants were issued for the arrest of R. Bleimehl and Frank Anderson.

R. Bleimehl appeared before Judge Bridgman and plead guilty. He afterward attempted to appeal the case and obtained a case of supercedes on Judge Bridgman which acts as an appeal prohibiting him from any further proceedings in the case until there is a hearing in the circuit court.
