Many Blazes on Coldest Day-Illinois Club Burned.

Chicago, Jan. 7.—The coldest day of the winter thus far proved to be the busiest day Chicago firemen have had for many months. More than 100 alarms were sounded yesterday and several stubborn fires were fought. Losses totaling nearly \$1,000,000 were caused.
