Actresses' Benevolent Work.
Whatever criticism may be made on the women and girls of the stage it cannot be said that they are lacking in the spirit of benevolence.

It takes real work and abundance of good spirits to go into the big buildings and the streets of Chicago and "tag" every man to contribute to the needs of sufferers.

One cannot but admire the cheerful activity of a bunch of merry young women spending a whole day in collecting funds before going to their hard services on the stage in the evening.

Their charming, joyous beauty was irresistible and the net result of the day was an addition of \$2,141.39 to the Earthquake Relief Fund as a result of that day's work.

Among those tagged was Mayor Busse, and the Record-Herald gives the following account of the interview: When Mayor Busse came down to the city hall a young woman attempted to fling her arms around his neck, at the same time pleading, "Let me tag you." The mayor blushed. He gave a \$5 bill. Later when he was asked to pose for a picture with a young woman fastening a tag in his lapel, he said:

"Nothing doing. My wife won't let me."
However, when he beheld Miss Elsie Marks, an employe of the county recorder's office, who had been selected as official tagger, he relented.

"All right," he said, "go ahead, but make it quick. I don't like posing. It's melodramatic, but under the circumstances—" and then the photographer let off the flash light.

That was one feature of the day. Another was two frail girls holding up traffic in mid-afternoon on State street. They were Misses Ada Mead and Cecile Breton, of the Garden Theater. They were stationed in front of Mandel Brothers' store when a flock of newspaper photographers arrived. A big crowd gathered and the young women proceeded to grab promising looking "taggers," drag them into focus and tag them while the cameras clicked.

"That must be hard work," some one suggested.

"No," said Miss Breton. "I like it. It is the easiest money I ever got. Why, I've sent in \$50 already and I've got this box almost full."

Rose Green and Josephine Bongiorno were stationed in the corridor of the Chamber of Commerce Building. They used up 1,000 tags each during the day and filled two boxes with small change.

Miss Louise Simonini was at the Board of Trade Building all day and filled three boxes.

"It's fun," she said. "My, I never knew there was so much change in the world. Every one around here seems to be rich. Even the messenger boys gave me dollars."

Mrs. John Forniclar and Mrs. L. M. Showerman, both 60 years old, were at the stockyards. "Every man we asked bought a tag," said Mrs. Forniclar. "And some of them bought two or three. We filled two boxes."
