

any one person and as compared with former works attempted by strangers, there can be no comparison. Material for the chapter on medicine and surgery will be furnished by Dr. F. C. Knight, who knows the County history, in their respects probably better than any other man. Formation chapters, or that relating to the earliest history, including the Indians, first white organization periods, reminiscences of early times etc., will be furnished by Elisha Phillips of Waukegan.

Mr. R. M. Ingalls of Waukegan has generously offered his valuable collection of historical data for chapters on subsequent periods and will contribute in no small degree to the success of the work.

Robert Conally of Waukegan, has offered his assistance and the use of his private library. Hon. W. C. Upton will furnish the material for a chapter on the Bench and Bar of Lake County since 1800 and State papers of the late Judge Clark W. Upton on the same subject, will render the prior history of this profession of great value and of absorbing interest. Jay Brewster of Waukegan will have access to the oldest records of masonry in the county, and the chapter on Freemasonry from the settlement will be handled with the single purpose of making it both accurate and interesting. The secret societies will be treated by those most capable of handling those subjects.

The stories of the different townships will be written by capable men, who will be able to import to their chapters a value which no other history has ever possessed.

Warren Heath will write of Libertyville Township. A. W. Fletcher, well known and esteemed citizen of Highland Park has kindly consented to give a history of Deerfield Township. Prof. Jesse L. Smith of Highland Park will give a chapter on Geology, for which subject he is well qualified.

A chapter on early Indian History, by Frank R. Grover, Vice President of Evanston Historical Society. This chapter dates from 1696. Mr. Grover being an authority on this subject. This chapter will be very interesting.

Prof. J. J. Halrey of Lake Forest, donates a chapter on Shields Township. J. K. G. McClure, President of McCormick Theo. Sem, has kindly consented to aid in making the work complete.

Judge V. V. Barnes contributes the history of Zion City, the only full and complete history of this remarkable place ever published.

George H. Bastian of the Waukegan Daily Sun is one of our editors.

Hon. George Edmund Foss introduces Government Statistics in one of the chapters of this interesting work.

E. M. Kelly, editor of the Lake County Independent is author of the history of Libertyville.

Hon. E. D. Shurtleff, speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives give the volume a history of State affairs.

Records of military affairs will be furnished by men who have collected data for many years.
