The Board of Local Improvements met in the City Hall Wednesday evening, May 26th; among other things a resolution was passed for the improving of Glencoe Ave. from Sheridan Place to Lincoln Ave. We are glad to note that Engineer Bowen has made some recommendations tending to improve our streets so as to meet conditions caused by automobile traffic. The main features in his suggestions were a sand foundation, curbs on either side, the widening of the street, flattening of the crown of the road and bonding the top course of stone with a tar preparation, thereby making a dustless, waterproof road, easily cleaned and maintained. Mr. Bowen was our city engineer for a number of years and is thoroughly familiar with the nature of our soil and conditions existing which affect our local street improvements.
