ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

An Ordinance Making Appropriations for Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1909, to May 31, 1910.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois:

Section 1. That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and the same are hereby appropriated for corporate purposes for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 1909, and ending May 31, 1910.

Parks, Boulevards, Driveways and Boating Basins.

For acquiring, laying out, establishing, constructing and maintaining parks, boulevards, driveways and boating basins.....\$1,200 00

Salaries of Officers.

For salaries of secretary, treasurer, attorney, engineer, clerks and other employees, including a police force..... 300 00

Total amount appropriated.....\$1,500 00

Section 2. All unexpended balances of any item or items of any general appropriation made by this ordinance may be expended in making up any deficiency in any item or items in the same general appropriation and for the same general purpose or in a like appropriation made by this ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
