AN ORDINANCE  
 Levying Taxes For Corporate Purposes For The Fiscal Year From May 1, 1909 To April 30, 1910

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois:

Section 1. That whereas the total amount of all appropriations legally made for all corporate purposes and to be collected from the tax levy of the fiscal year of said city, ending April 30, 1910, having been ascertained by said City Council to be the sum of Thirty three thousand six hundred dollars (\$33,600.00), and the purpose for which appropriations are made and the sum or amount appropriated for each purpose being as follows:

Streets, Alleys and Bridges  
 For constructing, maintaining and repairing streets, alleys and bridges.....\$ 8,000.00

Salary of Officers  
 For salary of city officers.....8,050.00

Street Lighting  
 For street lighting purposes.....4,740.00

Library  
 For Public Library purposes.....1,500.00

Bond and Interest  
 For bonded indebtedness and interest falling due.....10,600.00

Miscellaneous  
 For miscellaneous corporate purposes not hereinabove enumerated.....710.00

Total Amount Appropriated.....\$ 33,600.00

Now therefore, said City Council does hereby levy said Thirty three thousand six hundred dollars (\$33,600.00) upon all property subject to taxation within said city, as the same is assessed and equalized for the State and County purposes for the current year, as the City taxes for the City of Highland Park for said year ending April 30, 1910.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a copy of this ordinance duly certified, with the County Clerk of Lake County, State of Illinois, on or before October 9, 1909.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

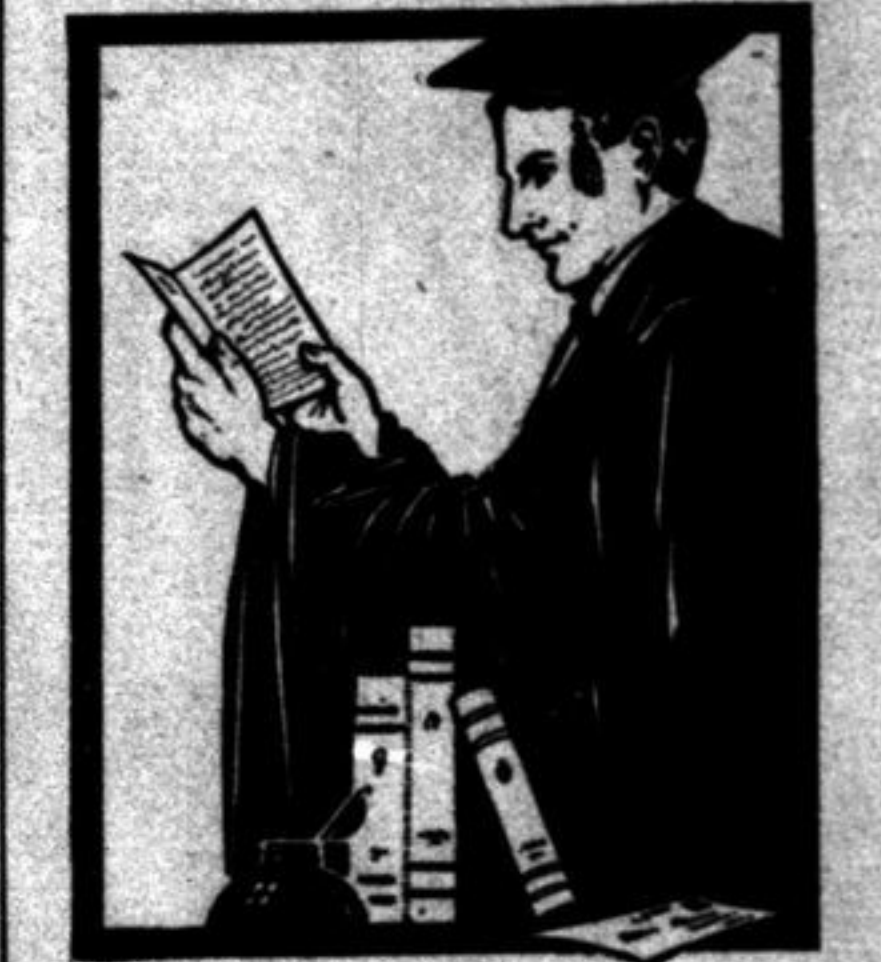
