It is only four seasons ago that H. B. Warner came to this country to act as leading man for Eleanor Robson. Next Sunday, Nov. 28, his name will shine forth in electric letters from the front of the Studebaker, a full-fledged star in one of the most promising new plays of the year, Edwin Milton Boyle's "These Are My People," a sequel to his "The Squaw Man." Almost the moment Warner made his American debut it was realized that our native stage had won a distinct acquisition when it lined this clean-cut young Englishman to this side of the pond. He combines a rare type of manliness with a natural method of acting in a way that wins the hearts of audiences instantly, and this has made him a great matinee idol without being any the less a man's man. He is that unusual specimen of the genius actor who shares the respect, admiration and regard of both

In a way, he is decidedly English, but certainly the kind of an Englishman we should like to see more often. In his new play Warner plays the part of the little Hal of "The Squaw Man" developed into a young man of twenty-five or so, and put through a course of sprout in being trained as an English gentleman, without having robbed him of his love for the land of his birth. It is a part that should suit Warner to a T.
