A LITTORAL DEFENSE CORPS.

Recent developments suggest the thought that the time may have arrived for the creation of a littoral defense corps as a distinct branch of the military establishment. The strength of the movement to exclude the marines from naval vessels and confine their functions to the guarding of navy yards and bases seems to have become apparent even to the marines themselves, says the New York Tribune.

Coaling seems to be destined to become a matter of vital importance to warships, not only because of the absolute necessity of the fuel, but because of the dangers which have been revealed by the fact that high explosives have been found in a number of instances, of late, in the coal for the bunkers of British war vessels.

To Retain the Grand Prix. Automobile manufacturers in America have for two years contended that racing pays and they have supported their belief to such an extent that from twenty-five to thirty road races a season are contested.

Rossman May Buy Team. Claude Rossman, formerly of the Detroit Tigers and St. Louis Browns of the American league, may break into the minor leagues, as it is said he is to purchase an interest in the Saginaw Southern Michigan league team and will manage it next year.
