"On Tuesday, April 12, 1910 was held in the Lincoln School quite a representative meeting of the residents of school district No. 108.

The object of the meeting was to explain why the election called for Saturday, April 16, 1910 is for a Board of Education to consist of a President and six members, in place of an election for a Director for a term of three years, as heretofore, and to discuss ways and means to proceed in the election.

It was the sense of the meeting that harmony be maintained and that the Board of Education should be comprised of members residing in different parts of the district, so that all localities get representation. The meeting then suggested names of persons residing in different localities of the district as candidates for nomination, from which list was nominated, by ballot, the following persons to be candidates for President and members of the Board of Education.
