Last Day In Rome Busy. Mr. Roosevelt's last day in Rome was as busy as were the two preceding days. After devoting two hours to his mail and telegrams he left his hotel at ten o'clock for a call on Prof. Giacomo Boni, the archaeologist. At 12 o'clock he received a visit from Baron Fava, former Italian ambassador at Washington.

Guglielmo Ferrero, the historian, entertained Mr.' Roosevelt and a few other friends at luncheon. At the same time Mrs. Roosevelt was a luncheon guest of Mrs. Leishman, wife of the American ambassador. There were 20 women in the party. Later Mr. Roosevelt went to the embassy and met Mr. Leishman's guests and other American and Italian friends who had called there.
