## RAVINIA PARK OPENS JUNE 25th.

It has now been definitely decided that Ravinia Park will open its summer concert season Saturday evening, June 25. The announcement has been made that advance subscription tickets while disappearing as to the amount, is sufficient to justify the Receiver in opening the Park as usual.

Among the attractions booked for this year are, the Chicago Philharmonic Orchestra of fifty pieces, under the direction of Chevalier Eganuel; the Theodore Thomas Orchestra of fifty pieces under the direction of Frederick Stock; and the New York Symphony Orchestra of fifty pieces, under the direction of Walter Damrosch. The first named Orchestra will appear at the Park for the three weeks beginning June 25th and will be followed by the Theodore Thomas Orchestra.

It is said that Ravinia Park has no equal in the United States as a summer concert garden, as most of them cater to a class of people who pay little or no attention to the music, whereas at Ravinia Park, one hears the best Orchestras in the country under exceedingly favorable conditions. This beautiful Park is a great boon to all North Shore residents and it is hoped that this season will be financially successful, as on that may depend its future.

The Chicago and Milwaukee R'y. Co. by reason of large additions to its equipment, will be able this year to handle the traffic to and from the Park in a very satisfactory manner.

It is expected that as usual, out-door plays will be given throughout the summer, and we also learn that a number of soloists have been engaged, so that may be more of a variety to the program. There will also be one week of out-door Opera during July.

A feature this year will be what may be termed "A popular program" to be rendered every Monday evening. Thursday afternoons as formerly, will be known as Children's day and on Friday evenings will be the Wagner program, in which one-half the numbers will be by that celebrated composer.

## AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A TAX UPON ALL FOREIGN FIRE INSURANCE COMPANIES DOING BUSINESS IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Highland Park:

SECTION 1. That all corporations, companies or associations not incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois, and which are engaged in the City of Highland Park, in effecting fire insurance, shall annually pay as a tax to the City Treasurer of the City of Highland Park for the maintenance, use and benefit of the Fire Department of said City, the sum of two per cent of the annual gross receipts received by said corporation, company or association in said City, said payments to be made as hereinafter provided. Said corporations, companies or associations shall pay said rate above specified upon the amount of all premiums which during the year ending on every first day of July, shall have been received from any insurance effected or agreed to be effected in said city, by or with such corporations, companies or associations respectively.

SECTION 2. Every person who shall act in the City of Highland Park as agent or otherwise, for or on behalf of any such corporation, company or association, shall on or before the 15th day of July, of each and every year, render to the City of Highland Park, a full, true and just account, verified by his or her oath, of all premiums which, during the year ending on every first day of July preceding such report, shall have been received by him or her, in behalf of any such corporation, company or association, and shall specify in said report the amount received for fire insurance. Such agents shall also pay to the Treasurer of said City of Highland Park, at the time of rendering the aforesaid report, the amount of rate fixed by said ordinance. If such report be not rendered on or before the day herein designated for that purpose, or if the said rate shall remain unpaid after that day, it shall be unlawful for any such corporation, company or association, so in default, to transact any business of insurance in said city until the said requisition shall have been fully complied with; but this provision shall not relieve any such corporation, company or association from the payment of any rate that may be taken in violation hereof.

SECTION 3. Any corporation, company or association or its agent or agents who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to said City of Highland Park in an action to recover the amount of said tax so unpaid to said City, to be brought in the name of said city, against said corporation, company or association, or its agent or agents for money had and received.

SECTION 4. Any corporation, company or association or its agent or agents, who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall forfeit and pay to said City of Highland Park the sum of twenty-five dollars upon conviction, for each and every offense.

SECTION 5. And in addition to the penalties and liabilities herein imposed any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be further subject to the penalties of fine and imprisonment as imposed by section two of an act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled "An Act to Enable Cities, Towns and Villages, organized under any General or Special Law, to Levy and Collect a Tax or License Fee from Foreign Fire Insurance Companies for the benefit of Organized Fire Departments," passed July 1, 1895, and the amendments thereto.

SECTION 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
