A remonstrance of John C. Wilken and others against the proposition to vacate the alley in Block 41 was presented and read. Later Mr Wilkin, by permission addressed the Board in support of the remonstrance. The matter was laid aside for consideration in committee of the

The Chairman of the Judiciary and Corpora tions Committee reported that he could not approve the bond presented by Sieber & Kent, ap plicants for sidewalk-builder's license, in its present shape. It being a personal security bond, the names of the partners should be stat ed and there should be blanks for property schedules.

Chairman Sayles, from the Street and Alley Committee moved that a proposition of the Magie Bros, of Chicago to oil the Glencce streets this year for four cents per lineal foot for 16 foot roadways and wider ones in proportion, be excepted and they be authorized to go ahead. His motion proposed that this cost be paid equally by the abutting owners on both sides of the street, while the Village would assume the trouble of sending and collecting the
