**AN ORDINANCE**

Levying Taxes For Corporate Purposes For The Fiscal Year, From May 1, 1910 To April 30, 1911.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois:

SECTION 1. That where as the total amount of all appropriations legally made for all purposes and to be collected from the tax levied of the fiscal year of said City, ending April 30, 1911, having been ascertained by said City Council to be the sum of Forty Thousand, Two Hundred and Fifty-Four Dollars (\$40,254.00) and the purpose for which said appropriations are made and the sum or amount appropriated for each purpose being as follows:

- SALARY OF OFFICERS FUND.  
For salaries of City Officers... \$ 7,500 00
- STREET AND ALLEY FUND.  
For street and alley purposes... 5,780 00
- DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS FUND  
For salaries and other expenses incident thereto... 2,750 00
- STREET LIGHTING FUND.  
For street lighting purposes... 6,100 00
- LIBRARY FUND.  
For Public Library Purpose... 1,500 00
- BOND AND INTEREST FUND.  
For Bonded Debt Falling Due... 4,000 00
- For Interest Falling Due... 3,015 00
- MAINTAINING PAVED ROADS FUND.  
For the purpose of Maintaining Paved Roads... 4,000 00
- SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS.  
For the City's Part of Certain Improvements... 3,427 00
- MISCELLANEOUS FUND.  
For Miscellaneous purposes... 212 00

TOTAL APPROPRIATED.....\$40,254 00  
Now, therefore, the said City Council does hereby levy said Forty Thousand two hundred and Fifty-four Dollars (\$40,254.00) upon all property subject to taxation within said City, as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County Purposes for the current year, as the City Taxes of the City of Highland Park for said year, ending April 30, 1911.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a copy of this ordinance, duly certified, with the County Clerk of Lake County, State of Illinois, on or before October 1, 1910.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
