sary for the construction of a concrete  
cement sidewalk five feet wide to be  
constructed in upon and along the west-  
erly side of Green Bay Road from the  
southerly line of Lincoln Avenue thence  
southerly to the City Limits of the City  
of Highland Park (except where con-  
crete sidewalk is now laid) the Southerly  
side of Walnut Avenue from the Easter-  
line of Oak Avenue easterly to the west-  
erly line of the Right-of-Way of the  
Chicago North Western Railroad Com-  
pany; on the westerly line of Oak Ave.,  
thence southerly to the northerly line of  
Deerfield Avenue; on the northerly line  
of Deerfield Avenue from the easterly  
line of Oak Avenue thence easterly to  
the westerly line of the Right-of-way of
