COUNCIL CHAMBER

CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK

Minutes of regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Highland Park, held Tuesday evening, December 6th, 1910.

Officers present:—Honorable Mayor Dooley, Alderman Tillman, Kline, Everhart, McPherson, Doty, Stevens and Bahr, and Attorney Mason. Absent, Alderman Shields.

Minutes of November meeting were read and approved. Plat of subdivision of Lots 11 and 12, Block 68, south part of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, was submitted and on motion of Alderman McPherson, seconded by Alderman Everhart, said plat was ordered approved, provided the owners of said subdivision comply with the requirements of the City Ordinance concerning the acceptance and approval of the plat.

Communication from August Benson, objecting to the enforcement of the ordinance providing for the construction of a concrete sidewalk in front of Lots 1 and 2, Block 51. Alderman Bahr moved, seconded by Alderman Stevens that the communication be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. Motion prevailed.

Communication from Willa M. L. Knapp objecting to the manner of constructing pavement and bridge in front of her property on Ravine avenue. On motion of Alderman McPherson, seconded by Alderman Bahr, same was referred to the Board of Local Improvements.

The following communication, signed by W. Witten was read:— To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Highland Park: Gentlemen:—

Realizing the necessity of more efficient fire protection, the Fire Department has decided to submit the following proposition for your approval: We propose to furnish the necessary funds (approximately \$500 to \$600 for the purchase of a team of good horses to be used solely by the Fire Department, provided the City will agree to pay for the maintenance of said horses and appropriate the sum of \$65.00 per month, salary for one fireman and \$1.00 per night each, for two men.

The city will also be expected to provide suitable quarters for the men and horses in the Fire Department Building. Respectfully Submitted, Highland Park Volunteer Fire Department, by W. WITTEN, Chief.

On motion of Alderman Bahr seconded by Alderman Doty, the above communication was referred to the Finance Committee. Reports of the City Clerk and Marshall were on the desk of each alderman.

Report of the Commissioner of Public Works:— To The Honorable Mayor and City Council, of the City of Highland Park: Gentlemen:—

The Contractor for the building of the concrete bridge on the County line has the bridge completed with the exception of the hand rail and putting the "Tartaria" on the roadway slab wearing surface, since he has the "Tartaria" and all other materials on the job, I would think it would be all right to allow him an estimate of 85 per cent of the contract, less the amount of cost of labor in putting the material on the roadway and the finishing of the hand rail, this I would estimate at a cost of \$100.

I would therefore recommend that the Contractor, Mr. Jay Rositer be allowed 85 per cent of his contract, less \$100, which would be \$3468.00, including the \$200 extra allowed for the changing of the rail, deducting the previous estimate allowed him of \$2000, would leave him \$1468 due one half of which is paid by the City of Highland Park and one-half by the Commissioners of New Trier Township. Alderman McPherson moved, seconded by Alderman Everhart, a suspension of the rules for the purpose of acting upon the above report of the Commissioner of Public Works. Motion was carried. Alderman McPherson moved, seconded by Alderman Everhart, that the report of the Commissioner of Public Works be accepted and the recommendations therein be concurred in. Motion was lost. Ayes:—Ald. Everhart, McPherson and Doty. Nays:—Alderman Tillman, Kline, Stevens and Bahr.

The Commissioner of Public Works then explained to the city Council his reasons for recommending the payment in the sum of \$1468 on the County Line Bridge Contract. Thereupon Alderman Bahr moved, seconded by Alderman Stevens to reconsider the report of the Commissioner of Public Works. Motion was carried.

Alderman McPherson moved, seconded by Alderman Everhart, that the report of the Commissioner of Public Works be accepted and the recommendations therein be concurred in. Motion was lost. Ayes:—Ald. Everhart, McPherson and Doty. Nays:—Alderman Tillman, Kline, Stevens and Bahr. An ordinance licensing vehicles was presented and on motion of Alderman Bahr, seconded by Alderman Everhart, action of same was deferred. An ordinance regulating the stoppage of cars, trains and electric railroads and street railroads at street intersections in the City of Highland Park was presented. Alderman Doty moved, seconded by Alderman McPherson, seconded by Alderman Everhart, that the report of the Commissioner of Public Works be accepted and the recommendations therein be concurred in. Motion was carried. Ayes:—Alderman Tillman, Kline, Everhart, McPherson, Doty, Stevens and Bahr.

Alderman McPherson moved, seconded by Alderman Everhart a suspension of the rules for the purpose of acting upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee. Motion was carried.

Alderman McPherson moved, seconded by Alderman Tillman that the sum of \$169.23 be paid to W. B. Smith, as recommended by the Finance Committee. Carried, Ayes:—Alderman Tillman, Kline, Everhart, McPherson, Doty, Stevens and Bahr.

Report of the Board of Local Improvements:— To The Honorable City Council, City of Highland Park: Gentlemen:—

The matter of the claim of Mr. Carl Grant for a rebate on his sewer system which was referred to the Board of Local Improvements by your Honorable Body, we beg to report that we have investigated the claim of Mr. Grant and find the conditions are as reported by the Commissioner of Public Works at the meeting of your honorable body on November 1, 1910.

We would therefore recommend that the report of the Commissioner of Public Works as submitted be approved. Respectfully, WILLIAM M. DOOLEY, FRITZ BAHR, Board of Local Improvements.

Ordinances for the construction of concrete sidewalks on the westerly side of Dean Avenue from Roger Williams Avenue to Cedar Avenue and on the easterly side of Dean Avenue from Roger Williams Avenue to Sheridan Road, were presented and on motion of Alderman McPherson seconded by Alderman Stevens same were ordered engrossed.

Alderman Bahr moved, seconded by Alderman Stevens that a sum not to exceed \$100 be appropriated for cleaning and improving the public park adjoining Mr. Kimball's property. Carried.

Alderman Stevens moved seconded by Alderman Bahr that the Street and Alley Committee be empowered to install a light on Green Bay Road South of Lincoln Avenue. Motion was carried.
