the sick. Up to date he has taken out one child with diphtheria, one of those mild ambulatory cases that spreads contagion faster, than 20 doctors can keep up, within weeks, but by early diagnosis and isolations we have spared an epidemic which would cost the citizens of Highland Park untold expense, sickness and possibly death by delayed discovery.

Dr. A. R. Sheldon has had a similar experience at the High school where he has been inspecting 210 pupils, three times a week and to much credit can not be given him for the faithful performance of his duties. Dr. H. S. Haskins who has charge of the infant class on Central Avenue inspecting from 60 to 75 children three times a week has had the good fortune to find but one case of tonsillitis which demanded exclusion but nevertheless is constantly on the watch for suspicious cases; which is the only sure way of protecting the rest of the little ones. I wish to say, I have carefully inspected the Lincoln Avenue School containing 93 pupils and the Ravinia School containing on an average of 28 to 35 and have found them all to date, in very good physical condition as far as contagion is concerned. Another point I wish to present to your honorable body is:—Dr. L. M. Bergan has a laboratory fully equipped with all modern appliances for the examination of cultures taken from the throats of children and is doing early prompt and good work for the inspectors which is a saving of time [which is of the most important in diphtheria] from 12 to 24 hours is accessible night or day and we cannot be too thankful that we have such an up to date institution in our midst and a physician who is modern in every sense of the word.

On motion duly seconded, report was received and placed on file. The following report of the Commissioner of Public Works was read.

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council City of Highland Park.

Gentlemen:—

During the Month of June, July and August our records at the pumping station shows that there was 36 days that the engineers there had to put the relief pump in service and for the larger portion of those days both pumps were working at their full capacity varying from four hours to twelve hours. If either one of the pumps had been out of commission we would have been short of water and since we have put in a large number of new takers since the month of August it is very apparent that we will be short of water the coming summer unless we increase our pumping capacity to take care of the peak load during the summer months.

Then too, as you all know, the village of Glencoe desires to take water from us which will be out of the question unless you increase your pumping capacity.

It will take ninety days to build whatever design of pump is to be bought and thirty days to install them so that it is time that something should be done very soon to have pumps in operation by the first of June.

You all will agree that we should have a new pump installed for our own use wether we take on Glencoe or not.

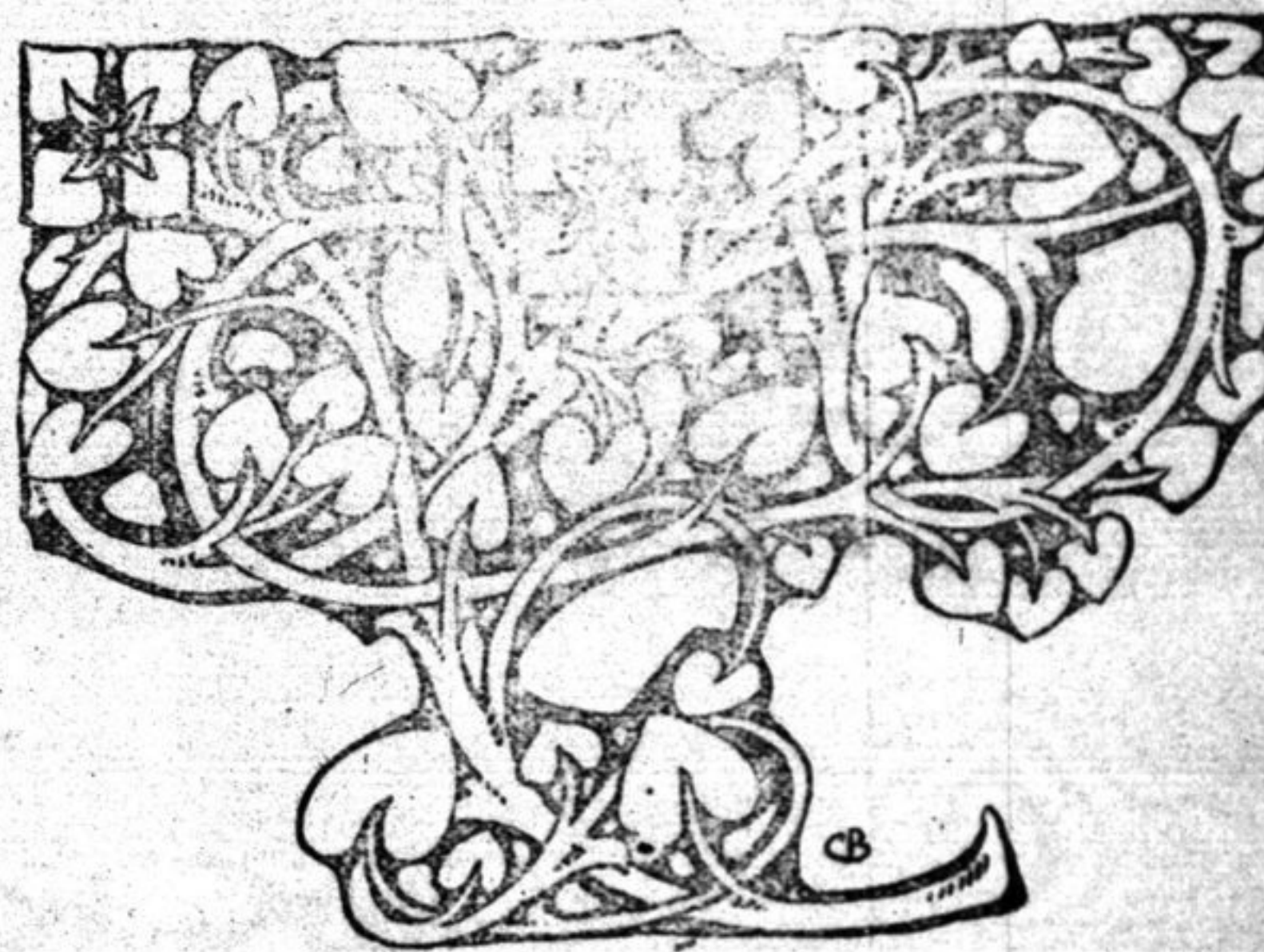
