SENATE IS STILL VERY CLOSE

Returns Indicate Dixon Will Be Dofeated in Montana-Democratic Gains Mostly Made East of Mississippl.

Washington, Nov. 6 .- Reports indicate that President-Elect Woodrow Wilson will have a Democratic congress with which to inaugurate his policies. From incomplete returns the next house of representatives will be composed of 283 Democrats, 138 Republicans and thirteen Pro-

Joseph G. Cannon, former speaker of the house was defeated for re-election to congress in the Eighteenth Illinois district by Frank T. O'Hair by about 800 votes.

Senate Will Be Close.

The indications are that the Democrats will have fifty-one senators and the Republicans and Progressives forty-five.

Dixon May Lose Seat.

In New Jersey, President-Elect County, on the first Monday of January Wilson's home, a United States senator will also be elected. Montana also elects a United States senator, and as the result there is in doubt Senator Dixon may lose his seat.

Conservative estimates would indicate that the next United States senate will undoubtedly be Democratic. This will give Mr. Wilson a working majority in both houses of congress."

The greatest gains made by the Democrats were in the states east of the Mississippi. In the Wilson landslide his party picked up congression. Governor Foss Is Re-Elected al seats in Massachusetts, New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware. In the central west the Democrats may have also gained one or two seats in Ohio, one in Indiana, two in Illinois and one in Missouri.

Strength of Progressives. The Progressive strength of thirteen as indicated by the returns, does not really show the fighting power that they will have in the next congress. Many of the so-called Republican congressmen in the northwest, on the coast and in the central west, openly setts, while Governor Foss will be reespoused the cause of Mr. Roosevelt elected by 70,000. and will be found lined up with the Progressive forces.
