

There is a den built in this bungalow with French doors opening into the living room. The dining room is lighted with three large windows at the side and has built-in sideboard in rear. Kitchen has built-in cupboards; also built-in space for refrigerator, where the ice can be put in from the rear porch. This porch is screened in and sashed in and can be used as a dining room in summer if desired. There is a grade entrance in the rear. Two good sized chambers can be finished in the second story, giving the capacity of four sleeping rooms. Six, twenty-eight feet wide and thirty-eight feet deep over main part. Front piazza is nine feet wide and twenty-two feet long. Full basement under entire house. First story, nine feet; second story, eight feet. If finished Maple or birch floors throughout first story. Finish throughout first story red oak or birch. Cost to build, exclusive of heating and plumbing, \$2,300.



CARE OF THE PIANO.

Always keep the piano closed when it is not in use. A piano is almost as sensitive to heat and cold as an invalid. It should not be placed too near a fire, as the heat draws the wood. Neither should it be near an open window, as on a wet day the dampness is apt to rust the wires.

The keys should be dusted frequently with an old silk handkerchief and rubbed occasionally with a cloth moistened with alcohol. If they get yellow rub with a very little lemon juice and whiten and remove this preparation with a damp cloth.

A Delicious Beverage.

Lemon sirup, a very refreshing drink, is made as follows: Take two pounds of sugar, two pints of water, an ounce of citric acid and half a dram of essence of lemon. Boil the sugar and water together for a quarter of an hour and put it into a basin. There let it remain until cold. Beat the citric acid to a powder, mix the essence of lemon with it, then add these two ingredients to the sirup. Mix well and bottle for use. Use two tablespoonfuls of sirup to a tumblerful of cold water.

Uncomfortable Collars.

If you have a collar that is too small to be comfortable sew a narrow ribbon at the top and bottom and tie in bows at the back. If it be a washing collar sew on white eyes and run the ribbon through them; then it can easily be removed when the garment goes to the laundry.

A ROLLER TABLE.

It Will Save Time and Steps in Doing Housework.

To save yourself steps and time put rollers under your kitchen table. You can then roll the table near the sink when you are washing dishes, into the pantry when you are mixing bread and want to be near the flour supply or in front of the china closet when you are giving it the weekly cleaning and want a place for the contents of the shelves while you clean them.

A roller table is surprisingly convenient in the kitchen, and all that is necessary is to put rollers on the table you already have. To save the work of scrubbing the top of the table have a piece of zinc tacked smoothly on it, leaving no sharp edges to do mischief. It will save hours of hard work, and hot kettles and cooking utensils leave no marks.
