CAMP FIRE GIRLS AFTER HONOR BEADS

Local Branches of Y. W. C. A. are Planning to give a Play in the Near Future

The Camp Fire Girls of Lake County are now working harder than ever to win "honor beads" and thus achieve the degree of Fire Maker. Four prizes have been offered in both Highland Park and Lake Forest by the chairman of the Young Women's Christian Association in these two towns, Mrs. H. E. Mason and Mrs. Van Wagenen Alling. The prizes are the regulation Indian bracelet obtained from the New York headquarters of the Camp Fire Girls for members who have attained the degree of Fire Maker. The bracelets are to be placed in the windows of stores on the main street of the towns. The girls are to take an examination or test some time in May to qualify for the prize.

Five groups of Camp Fire Girls have been organized under the Lake County Young Women's Christian Association, two in Lake Forest and three in Highland Park. The guardians of the groups are very important members as it is to them the girls look for leadership, and all guardians must receive their appointment from the National Committee at the New York office. Mrs. Gordon Hatley, Miss Ruth Bryant and Miss Adelaide Inman have served as guardians for the Highland Park groups this past winter. Miss Wales, the General Secretary of the Association, acts as Chief Guardian of all groups under the Lake County Y. W. C. A.

Obituary

Nels Swanson. The death of Nels Swanson, a former resident of Highland Park, who lived here twelve or thirteen years ago, occurred on March 28, in San Juan, Porto Rico, where he was engaged in the plumbing business. Surviving him are his wife and son, John, aged sixteen years, who are residing in Highland Park with Mrs. John O. Cummings, mother of Mrs. Swanson, one of the oldest residents of this city. Nels Swanson, who had been in business in Porto Rico, had made several trips to this city to visit his family and during the past winter, was taken ill while preparing to come here to reside permanently, and died as a result of a complication of diseases. He was formerly engaged in the plumbing business in this city as Swanson and Nolan, located in the Fletcher block. The body which arrived here Wednesday morning was taken directly to Prior's Undertaking Rooms instead of the Cummings residence because of the serious illness of both Mrs. Swanson and Mrs. Cummings. The funeral was held at two o'clock today at the J. O. Cummings residence on W. Central Ave. Interment at Sacred Heart Cemetery, Shermerville.
