THE CARE OF TREES

All trees whether natives or nursery grown need attention in the way of proper pruning, spraying and feeding. Our climatic conditions are anything but favorable to produce oak trees of enormous size and old age. Here and there we notice a giant but the great majority of trees with 15 and 18 inch diameter trunks begin to go back from year to year and especially is this true with such as are left to shift for themselves, while on the other hand their life could be prolonged many years by scientific pruning, by removing the deadwood and relieving the crowns of some of the superfluous growth.
