

# THE CARE OF TREES

All trees whether natives or nursery grown need attention in the way of proper pruning, spraying and feeding. Our climatic conditions are anything but favorable to produce oak trees of enormous size and old age. Here and there we notice a giant but the great majority of trees with 15 and 18 inch diameter trunks begin to go back from year to year and especially is this true with such as are left to shift for themselves, while on the other hand their life could be prolonged many years by scientific pruning, by removing the deadwood and relieving the crowns of some of the superfluous growth. Don't wait until your trees are half dead before you realize this fact, or wait until your general man about the place gets a chance to do some sawing. This work should be done by experienced men equipped with the proper tools. Have we got them? Yes, men, some of them have been with us for nearly 20 years, who are acquainted with our local conditions and are experts in this line. No time better than the present to do this work. You needn't get a tree surgeon with an office in New York for we are up-to-date and keep posted with every new method endorsed by the state experiment stations of the country.
