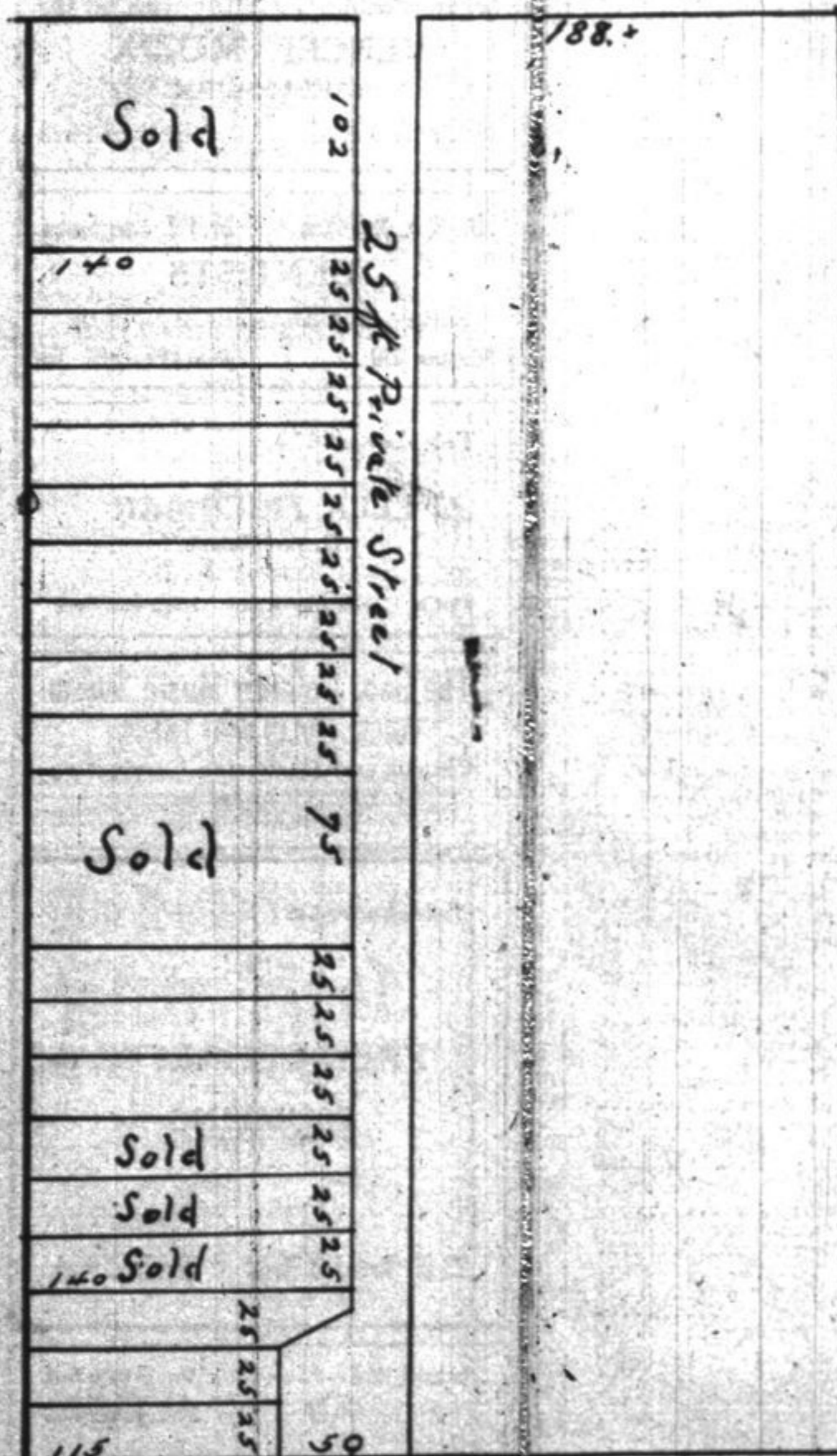

### FIRST RESCUE FOR LIFE SAVING CREW

#### SEVEN PERSONS BROUGHT IN TUESDAY

The Crew is Gathered Quickly and the Boat put out in Fifteen Minutes after the Alarm is Sounded

Members of the Life Saving Crew made a good record on their first call for duty when they gathered from all parts of the town and had the boat in the water within fifteen minutes after an alarm was sounded Tuesday. The cause was a signal of distress from a gasoline launch, containing six men and a boy, which after its engine went dead about three miles out had been towed in by another launch and tied to a pile south of the pier. The severe storm made the position of the men a dangerous one and when the members of the crew arrived they had donned life belts and were ready to jump and attempt to swim ashore though in all probability the 'back wash' would have carried them out in the lake. Later the boys went out and made the launch secure so that it came through the storm of the night without damage. Two of the men who were on their way to Green Bay remained over and returned with the launch to Chicago.

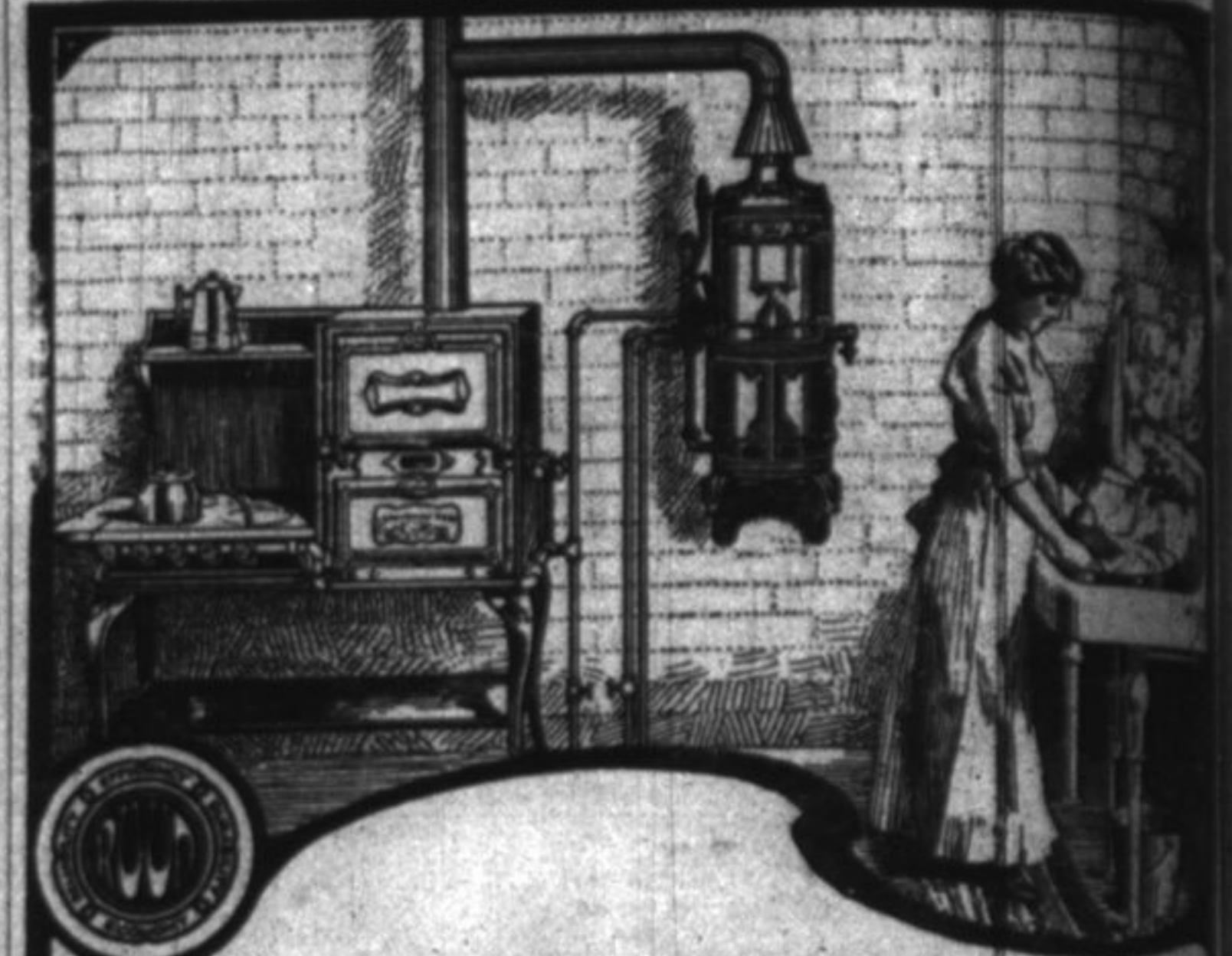
