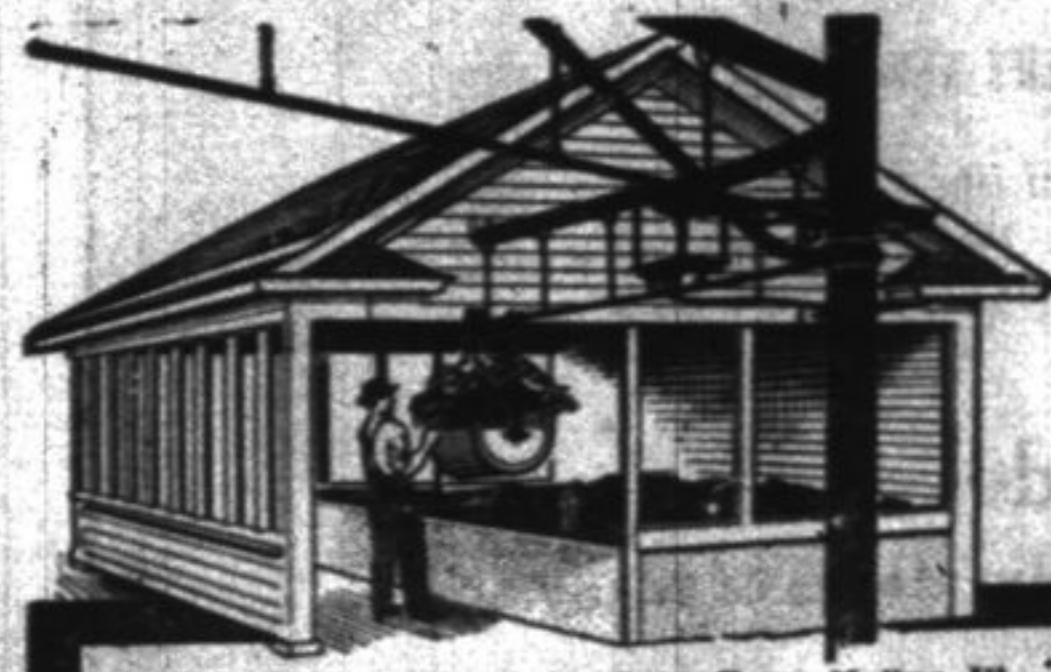

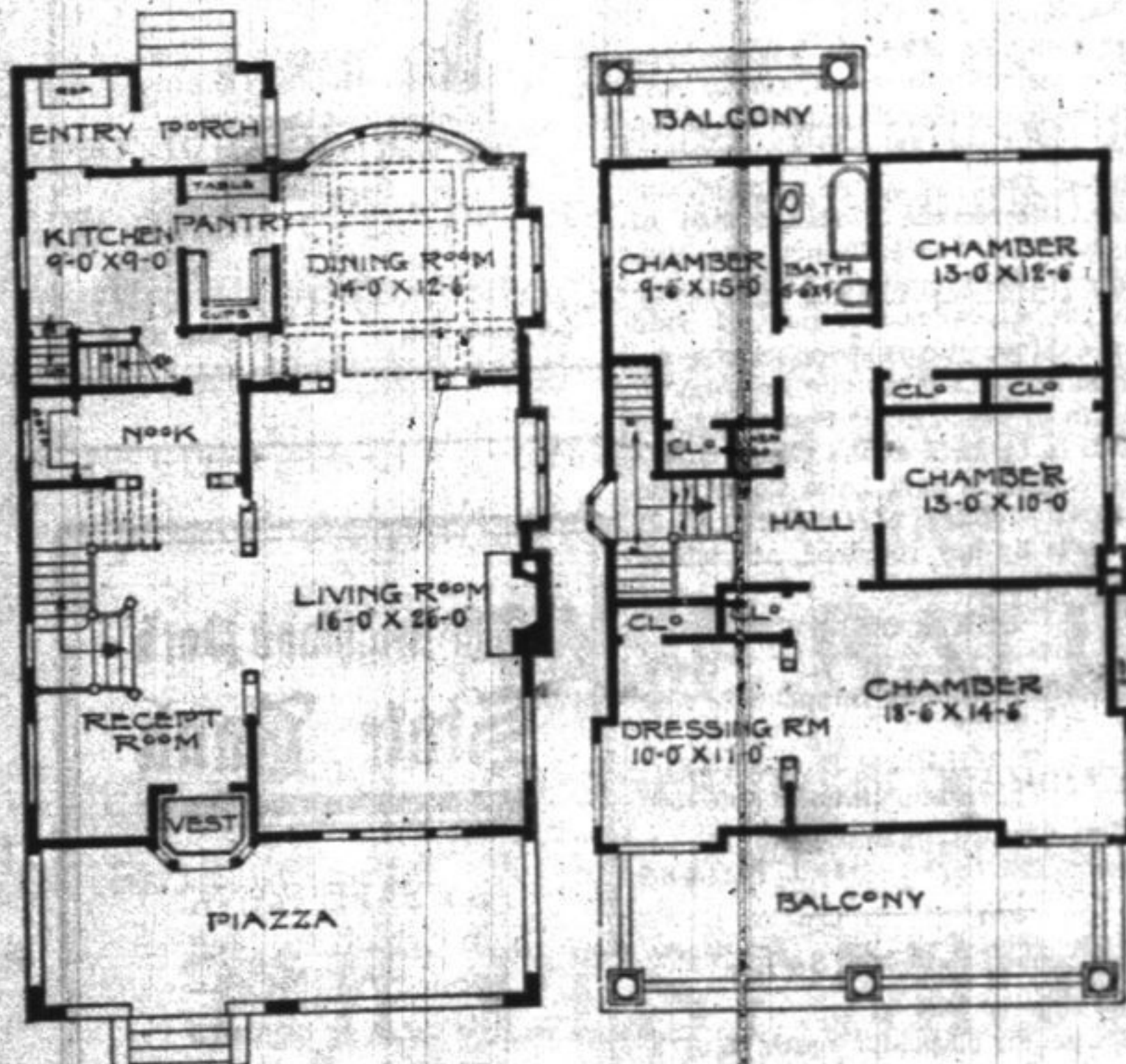

ILLINOIS PARAGRAPHS.

SPRINGFIELD—Each one of the present Illinois Republican congressmen—Madden, Mann, Britten, Copley, and McKenzie—will be a candidate for re-election next year, and each one of the old Republican contingent, defeated last November, expects to try for "vindication" in November, 1914. This list is headed by former Speaker Cannon in the Danville district, William B. McKelvey, manager of the Taft campaign in the Champaign district; John A. Sterling, Bloomington; George W. Prince, Galesburg; Charles E. Fuller, Belvidere; George E. Foss, Evanston; William A. Rothenberg, East St. Louis; William W. Wilson, Englewood, and some one representing the political organization of Napoleon B. Thistlewood, Cairo. James McKinley, who was not a candidate for re-election in the Rock Island district, is likely to be a candidate for the Republican nomination next September.

CHAMPAIGN—A fierce, uncontrollable mania for the possession of a racing automobile owned by Harold A. Shaw of Urbana, who was a student at the University of Illinois,

is declared to have been the motive for the murder of the young man, whose body was found buried on the farm of Robert Penman, near Philo, Gust Penman, for whose arrest a warrant charging him with murder has been issued, is a son of Robert Penman, a Champaign county farmer. The finding of the body of Shaw on the Penman farm furnished unmistakable evidence that Shaw had been murdered. The body had been hastily buried. The man who buried it had not even dug the grave sufficiently deep. The feet of the corpse were uncovered. Penman was arrested later near Danville and confessed his crime.

CHICAGO—A most desperate effort to keep from the records of the Butts commission the statement furnished by Lloyd Duke, city attorney of Ottumwa, Ia., in which officials of the Heart Independence league are charged with arranging for heavy graft out of the million-dollar purchase of voting machines, was made when the hearing was resumed in the county board room. C. S. Deneen says the documents will throw a flood of light on the entire transaction and lay bare the reasons for the eagerness of the election commissioners to enter into the "fat" contract.

Attorneys Dissolve Partnership.
Announcement was made today that Orvis & Beaubien, a well known Waukegan firm of attorneys, have dissolved partnership. Mr. Beaubien will carry on the work of the firm under the name of A. F. Beaubien. He takes the legal and real estate end of the business, while Justin K. Orvis will give his entire time to his railroad interests in the western part of the county.

Gymkhana Makes \$5,000 for Charity.
Lake Forest's gymkhana on Saturday afternoon realized \$5,000 to be divided between the Alice Home and the Lake Bluff Orphanage. This is the largest amount ever made by the Lake Forest Horse Association at its annual horse show and gymkhana. The amount last year was \$3,600.

Libertyville's fine new Methodist church, costing approximately \$20,000, was dedicated on Sunday, August 24th, an exceedingly appropriate program having been arranged. The City of Waukegan is taking an active interest in the preservation of its trees and is doing everything possible to prevent their extermination by the white cotton scale which has invaded Waukegan this year with more persistency than usual.
