### HOT SPRINGS FIRE

Fifty Blocks Burn, and Loss is Over \$6,000,000.

### WIND BAFFLES HEROIC EFFORT

Territory Burned Extends 7 to 10 Blocks in Width and 10 to 15 Blocks in Length--Little Rock and Other Departments Aid But of Little Avail.

HOT SPRINGS, ARK.--The military guards are patrolling a district a mile in length and from seven to ten blocks wide, swept by a fire which caused a loss of \$6,000,000. Governor Hays is in direct charge of the work of preserving order, preventing looting and giving aid in the devastated section.

At least 2,500 persons are homeless. Some of them are being cared for by friends who have escaped the fire, others have moved to the suburbs of the city and are camping on the ground. In the business section of Hot Springs are piled the few belongings that were saved from the various business houses and homes. These goods are being guarded. Five business blocks are included in the city the flames consumed.

The fire originated on Church street, three blocks east of the government reservation and near the army and navy hospital. It swept southeast away from the hospital and reservation for an hour when the rising wind shifted in direction and carried it again in the direction of the business section, taking the public utilities plant and every business structure on Melvern avenue. Crossing Melvern avenue the fire swept south, burning the Ozark sanitarium and beautiful high school building when the shifting wind current again carried the flames to Quachita avenue, sweeping a wide pathway, destroying the Garland county court house and for a time seriously threatening to turn back in its path and sweep down the main business section of Central and Quachita avenue.

The following are some of the principal buildings destroyed within a short space of two and a half hours: Park hotel; Water, Light and Gas plants; Ozark Sanitarium; high school building; Central Methodist church; Garland County Court house; Moody hotel; Sigler apartments; Iron Mountain station and shops; Bijou rink and unknown number of business blocks, smaller business buildings and residences, many of them in a palatial residence section.

### CARDINAL TUTO DEAD

Fails to Rally from an Operation Performed for Appendicitis. ROME -- Cardinal Joseph Calasanzio Vives y Tuto, prefect of the congregation for religious affairs, is dead. He failed to rally from a recent operation for appendicitis.

Cardinal Tuto was born at San Andrea de Llevantas, diocese of Barcelona, in 1854. He was created and proclaimed cardinal June 19, 1899. Early this summer it was reported he had become insane, but later physicians diagnosed his case as neurasthenia and he retired to a monastery.

### JEROME FREED ON GAMBLING CHARGE

Judge Orders Him Discharged After Three Testify.

COATICOOK, QUE.--Judge Mulvena at 8:30 at night, after hearing three witnesses, dismissed the charges against William Travers Jerome, stating that he had not been held legally and that all Canadians regret the manner in which he had been treated.

Jerome, in a brief speech, thanked the Canadian people for the way he had been received, and said he would not misinterpret sentiment of the best Canadian people toward him by the action of a few who instigated his arrest.

Only three witnesses were examined when the judge decided that there was no case and acquitted the defendant.

### ARTIST MILLAR KILLED

Wife is Also Victim When Railway Train Strikes Automobile.

NEW YORK -- Addison T. Millar, one of the most widely known painters and etchers of this country, and his wife were instantly killed when their automobile was struck by an express train near Norwalk, Conn. Two friends who were riding in the same machine were seriously hurt.

Mr. Millar and his wife had been residing in the artist colony at Silver Mine.

Shuman Names Goop to Senate. WASHINGTON -- The appointment of Irving Shuman of Sullivan, Ill., as sub-treasurer in Chicago, was sent to the senate by President Wilson. Mr. Shuman will reorganize the force of employees in the sub-treasury, replacing all of the Republicans holding supervising positions with Democrats, it is said.

The relations that existed between General Washington and his younger friend, "Light Horse Harry" Lee--the father of General Robert E. Lee--were exceedingly close and tender. Lee was inclined to be a spendthrift, and his lavish use of money often brought on him the paternal reproof of his older and more discreet friend--and the reproof was often followed by affectionate assistance in extricating him from his embarrassments.

Mrs. Washington was almost equally fond of the young officer, who often made long visits at Mount Vernon. During one of his sojourns there, Harry Lee remarked to his host at the breakfast table:

"General, I had a singular dream last night, which I must tell you. I actually dreamed that you made me a present of your Westmoreland place."
