Blocks in Width and 10 to 15 Blocks In Length-Little Rock and Other Departments Aid But of Little

HOT SPRINGS, ARK .- The military guards are patroling a district a mile in length and from seven to ten blocks wide, swept by a fire which caused a loss of \$6,000,000. Governor Hays is in direct charge of the work of preserving order, preventing looting and giving aid in the devastated section. At least 2.500 persons are homeless.
