Those of the Humming Bird Are About the Size of a Walnut.

The most exquisitely dainty home built by the bill and feet of birds is that of the ruby threated bumming When completed it is scarcely larger than an English walnut and is usually saddled on a small horizontal limb of a tree or shreb frequently many feet from the ground.
